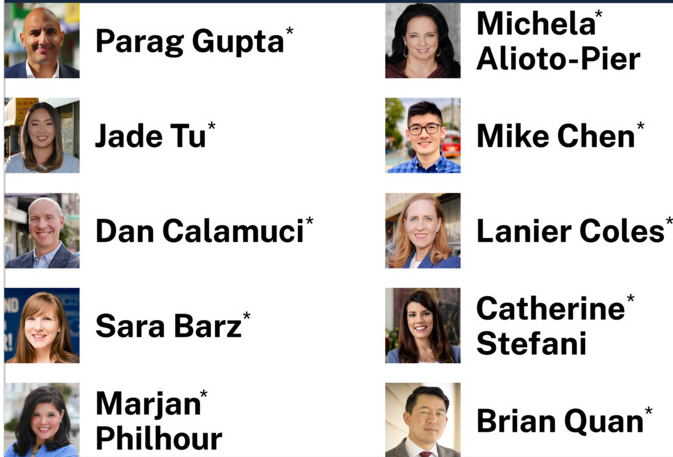

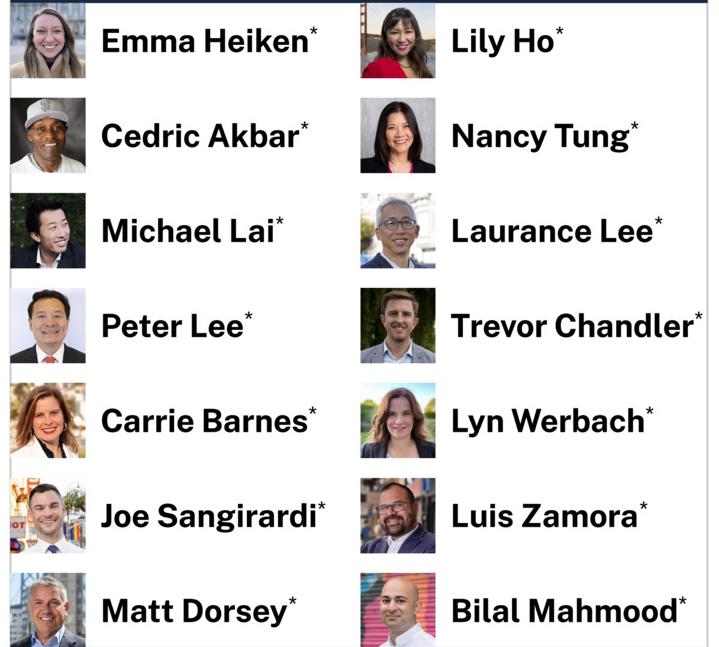

Zecher spent two decades as a civil litigator, teacher of Constitutional Law, and volunteer for local nonprofits. In 2019 Zecher was appointed by Governor Newsom to the Board of Directors of UC Law (formerly UC Hastings) in the Tenderloin.

Jean Roland has spent 22 years at the San Francisco District Attorney's office, where she has served as the Managing Attorney for the Domestic Violence, Elder Abuse, Stalking, Child Abuse, Sexual Assault and Child Abduction Units. She currently serves as the Managing Attorney of the General Felony Trial Unit.

In her role at the DA's office, she has personally reviewed **thousands** of criminal cases and made the tough calls. She will bring her decades of experience to the bench.

▲ **Yes to Proposition 1***

Behavioral Health Services Program and Bond Measure

Prop 1 will fund mental healthcare and drug abuse treatment across the state.

Local Propositions

▲ **Yes to Proposition A**

Affordable Housing Bond

Prop A will fund the construction and rehabilitation of housing for seniors, low-income groups, and victims of domestic violence and human trafficking. Similar bonds have built many thousands of homes.

▼ **No to Proposition B**

Cop Tax

Prop B creates a new fund intended for police recruitment, but it has no plan on how to pay for it. We support a fully-staffed police force, but **Prop B won't get us there** until we pay even higher taxes.

▲ **Yes to Proposition C**

Convert Vacant Offices to Homes

SF has one of the highest office vacancies in the nation: **over 35%**! Prop C will help vacant office buildings convert into new homes.

▲ **Yes to Proposition D**

Changes to Local Ethics Laws

Prop D will make uncontroversial changes to city ethics laws, including how gifts are handled and what is considered a bribe. Plus, it'll update ethics training to fight corruption.

▲ **Yes to Proposition E***

Police Department Policies and Procedures

Prop E will make it easier for SFPD to use new technology to help combat crime, and update vehicle pursuit policies so smash-and-grab thieves can be caught.

▲ **Yes to Proposition F***

Drug & Alcohol Treatment for City Services

74% of San Franciscans support this, according to our polling. Prop F will require people who are addicted to drugs or alcohol to get treatment in order to receive city services like cash and housing.

▲ **Yes to Proposition G**

Eighth Grade Algebra and SFUSD Math Curriculum Development

Prop G will tell SF Unified School District to bring back 8th grade algebra. Currently, SF public schools don't teach algebra until **9th grade**, but neighboring counties teach algebra as early as **7th grade**! Our kids deserve better. They deserve to learn math.
